Course outline for MATH 3242, Linear Algebra.

Textbook: Elementary Linear Algebra, Larson, 8th edition.

You can find copies of the textbook to order online (I am using the paperback version). If you go to the bookstore, they will give you (for a fee) an access code for the publisher's website, WebAssign (www.webassign.net). Once you have access and enter the class key for our course, you will also have access to the electronic version of the textbook.

Course Description:

We will cover the first seven chapters of the textbook, which discusses examples and applications of linear spaces. Finite-dimensional linear spaces include vector spaces and matrix spaces. We will also briefly look at infinite-dimensional vector spaces, where the vectors are functions of a single variable. Prerequisite: MATH 1920 (second-semester calculus). The first part of Calc III (MATH 2110) also starts with a discussion of vector spaces, and may be taken before or concurrently with MATH 3242.
